Join us for our week long retreat as we explore the sacred balance we walk. This is not just a balancing act between the mundane and faith-based aspects of our lives. No, we hope to share and learn a deeper understanding of what it means to truly walk that knives-edge.

Here is your official Dragonfest registration. **Please read all of the material in this packet - it is important!**

After we receive your registration form, you will receive a confirmation card. Ticket packets will be mailed out in approximately mid-July. You must have a ticket **with your name on it and a photo I.D.** to get into the Retreat. There will be no day passes issued for the Retreat again this year. Any special arrangements for hand-fastings need to be done in advance. Tickets are, as always, **non-transferable.** If it isn't **your name** on the ticket, you can't use it!

Registration will close at 1000 people or on July 1st, whichever comes first. If you need to copy the registration form, remember to copy both sides. A signed release must accompany **every** registration!

Due to an early opening of registration, t-shirt art and color choices will not be available until the middle of April. If you select to register early and decide to order a t-shirt later on, all that will be required is a simple email to our registration staff and a check or PayPal request for the remaining balance. This delay allows all of our great artist adequate time to submit artwork

Food Donations: In the spirit of community service, we are again asking for food donations for one of the local food banks. Please bring your donation in a **non-perishable sealed package**. (canned, jar, non-frozen)

Harmony Kitchen: This year we will again have a Harmony Kitchen in Area 5. Harmony Kitchen will serve continental breakfast (hot beverages and muffins/croissants) from 7 a.m. to 10 a.m. Harmony will reopen from 9pm to Midnight to serve only hot beverages. Chilly dancers and drummers welcome.

Bob Key Memorial Stone Soup: The Community Center Team has again planned for the Stone Soup Celebration. All soups are cooked on-site, from scratch. Breakfast Registration: This year in order to better serve you and keep our costs down, we are asking you to register for breakfast. In years past the Community Center has ended up with an embarrassing (and costly) surplus of food at the end of the Retreat. Having an accurate count of how many servings are needed would greatly reduce unknowns and costs. The way for us to get this information is for you to **tell us on your registration form**. Since breakfast is included in the price of registration this information also serves to keep ticket prices as low as possible. Please be considerate and only sign up for those mornings you know you will be eating at the Community Center. A meal ticket will be given to you at Retreat and you will need to bring that ticket to the community center each morning for breakfast.

Breakfast Menu: Hot trays will be Dfest eggs (vegan, spiced only), diced potatoes, breakfast sausage links, diced ham, and biscuits with gravy (vegan). In addition there will be cold cereal, hot oatmeal with fruit, muffins and croissants. Beverages will be coffee, tea, hot chocolate, milk, and lemonade.

Dragonfest 2009 Policies: If You Read Nothing Else In This Packet, Read This Section!!!

Clothing Optional Changes: Due to liability concerns on the part of Castle Mountain, we have been asked to restrict the clothing optional to designated areas. The entire lakefront and any area that can be seen from the lake is now beach attire required. Freedom Circle and certain other areas have been excluded and Castle Mountain is very sensitive to our need to make certain adjustments due to rituals or workshops and out of respect for our faith. Castle Mountain has conceded to lake access in area 5 for personal bathing rituals after 9:00pm. This turn of events is indeed unfortunate and Dragonfest will continue to pursue this issue as we fight to insure that the Retreat is an inclusive environment for everyone that attends. We know that this will come as an adjustment and shock to many of our retreat attendees and we are continuing to endeavor to make this unfortunate change felt as little as possible.

Wood Sales: As part as our cost saving measures Dragonfest's Land fund will no longer be selling firewood. Over the years, this has been a staple of the retreat but at great financial and logistical costs. Firewood will still be for sale, however we have transferred that responsibility back to the vendor we have long purchased our supplies from. Wood will now be sold for \$4.00 per bundle of 5 which is a dollar increase over what Dragonfest has been selling it for. While the Board and Operations has spent hours trying to get our attendees the most reasonable price possible, we want to further limit the impact by offering each family a courtesy wood ticket for their first bundle. These tickets will likely appear in your ticket packet, but the distribution method is still being determined.

Gate Schedule: - The Gate will open on Wednesday at 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. and then daily from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. except for Sunday when it will close at 4:00 p.m.

Day Passes: There will be **NO** day passes this year. A Discounted Weekend (Saturday/Sunday) pass has been established to allow those who need to work to still partake in our wonderful retreat. Weekend passes will be available starting in June 6th. A standard 2 hours work shift will not be required but any volunteer help is always appreciated.

Work Shift Policy: We require the following for Dragonfest work shifts. Every registered attendee of Dragonfest 16 years of age and older is required to sign up for a work shift – **no exceptions!** Dragonfest would not be the wonderful Retreat it is without the vast array of rituals and workshops, but neither can it be run without full support for the day-to-day duties. Manifesting a safe and harmonious spiritual Retreat for several hundred people is a BIG job, but when we all work together as a community it becomes a labor of love and sharing. Tasks for all ages and abilities are available, including (but not limited to) Safety, Hauling, Heralding, Community Center, Kiosk, Gate and Youthfest, just to name a few. Work shifts offer a wonderful opportunity to meet new friends and have a good time. Make the most of yours.

Attending Members who do not sign up and/or show up for a work shift, and do not make up the work shift during the Retreat, without a clear exemption, will not be allowed to attend Dragonfest for the following year unless they choose to donate an additional fee equal to one adult registration fee.

The fees will be applied to scholarships to Dragonfest. Should a member choose a **second** time not to fulfill a work shift obligation, the above penalty will be doubled. Electing a **third** time to avoid the work shift obligation will result in suspension from the Retreat. When evidence exists that a member has not done a work shift, that member will be notified in writing prior to the beginning of registration for the following year.

Fire Circles: - There will be **5** Drum/Fire Circles at Dragonfest this year.

Freedom Circle: Located in the Boy Scout camp. This is a "**clothing optional**" circle and no one under 18 years of age will be allowed. The circle starts at dusk and closes at midnight Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday night, and 1 a.m. on Saturday night.

Inspiration Circle: Located near the new Auxiliary Community Center. This is a facilitated magical drum circle providing a focused, balanced and intense blend of drumming, dancing and chanting. This is "**clothing optional**" and **NO** alcohol or drugs will be allowed. Everyone is welcome, but minors must be attended by their legal guardian at all times. The circle starts at dusk and closes at midnight Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday night, and 1 a.m. on Saturday night.

Trance Circle: Located at Hecate's Grove. This is a more laid back, spiritual drumming circle. Alcohol is allowed and the circle is "**clothing optional**". Everyone is welcome, but minors must be attended by their legal guardian at all times. The circle goes from dusk to midnight Wednesday through Friday and dusk to 1:00 a.m. Saturday night.

Merchant/Family Circle: Located in Merchant Row near the Entertainment Stage. It is a "**clothing required**" circle and anyone is welcome to join in. This circle is in the 10:00 p.m. curfew zone and therefore drumming ends at 10. We will have children's drumming, chant and storytelling volunteers each night.

Phoenix Circles: Located at the Phoenix Circle compound. This is "**clothing required**" and **NO** alcohol will be allowed. Everyone is welcome. The circle closes each night at 10 p.m.

Each circle will have appointed fire tenders who will start, tend and put the fire out each night. Please follow the rules set forth by Dragonfest and respect the fire tenders. Please inform the fire tenders of any **UNWELCOME** conduct ASAP. They will contact the Heads of Operations and Safety immediately. Remember, **NO means NO**.

RETREAT GUIDELINES

Read these guidelines carefully. By registering for the Retreat, you agree to comply with all of them. Violations of one or more of these guidelines are grounds for immediate ejection from the Retreat without refund.

Dragonfest Website: Check the website frequently but do not add a link to this page from your homepage. We want to keep you updated, but we do not want any outside publicity. We need to maintain a certain level of privacy, to insure that those who are worried about repercussions due to their religious beliefs feel comfortable visiting the site to get updates. The website is at www.dragonfest.org .

Refunds: 75% refunds will be given for cancellation requests postmarked by July 15. Refunds for requests postmarked before July 31 will be 50% of what was paid. No refunds will be given for cancellation requests postmarked August 1 or later. If you do not cancel, and do not attend the Retreat there will be no refund. Because of waiver requirements, tickets are issued individually, and **are not transferable**. If someone else arrives with your ticket, you will both be held accountable. Please let us know as soon as possible if you need to cancel. Requests must be made in writing to the Dragonfest PO box. No phone requests will be accepted.

Camping Areas: Set up, camp, park your car, and build fires in designated areas only. Stay within the areas designated for Retreat use.

Responsibility: Be responsible for the welfare of yourself, your belongings, and your family while at Dragonfest. Dragonfest Staff cannot be held liable for any personal injury or loss occurring to anyone during events at and/or connected with the Retreat.

Minors: Minors under 18 years of age may attend, but must come with at least one parent or other adult legally designated by parent or guardian as caretaker. All adults attending with minors must take responsibility for supervising them for the duration of the Retreat. Adults must make sure that they, as well as the minors attending with them, comply with all Retreat guidelines. If you are bringing children with you, you must be in their company and attending to them at all times yourself or you must find a responsible adult to be with them during times when the children are not at Youthfest. Neither Dragonfest Staff nor the Campground Staff can or

will be responsible for your children during the Retreat and the participation of minors in your company at Youthfest is at your own risk and discretion.

Security: When traveling to and from the site, as well as while on site, comply with all speed limits and ordinances. Be as unobtrusive as possible in passing through surrounding areas to keep disturbance of site neighbors to a minimum. Don't hitchhike to or from the site. Don't inform or call the attention of locals, the public media, or other non-Pagans to Dragonfest and its site location. Arrive and depart from Dragonfest only during those times that the Gate is open. Do not bring pets/animal friends, friends not registered, firearms, or illegal drugs. Do not bring alcoholic beverages not intended for personal consumption or for use otherwise inconsistent with these Dragonfest guidelines.

Alcohol and Tobacco: Alcohol and tobacco use is limited to adults of legal age. Alcohol use must be in moderation and consistent with the spiritual orientation of the Retreat. Phoenix Circle is a support and camping area for Pagans in recovery from addictions and no alcohol is permitted there at any time. If you smoke tobacco, be considerate of nonsmokers who do not wish to be exposed to tobacco smoke, and make sure cigarette butts are extinguished thoroughly and placed in the trash, not thrown on the ground.

Health Conditions and Concerns: We will have a camping area close to the Community Center for disabled access; however, the site is not readily wheelchair accessible. If you have a disability or any physical and/or mental health conditions that require you to take medication and/or require occasional or periodic medical attention, you should consult your doctor before attending. The site is 8,000+ FT. above sea level, so if you have a heart condition, allergies, asthma or lung condition, you should check with your doctor before you register. Since there are no pharmacies near the Dragonfest Site, you need to bring an adequate supply of any medications you may need with you. **If you feel you cannot perform an easy work shift, you should definitely check with your doctor before you register. Also, altitude can affect medication dosages.**
Note: Dragonfest medical directors may require you to leave the Retreat for uncontrolled medical conditions. If this occurs you would need to obtain a signed medical release to return to the Retreat.

Community: Attend the daily breakfast meetings and the corporate meeting. Sign up for and do at least 2 hours of work. Share in the cooperative community spirit of the Retreat. Be friendly and helpful to others at the Retreat.

Respectfulness: All the rules of conduct that apply in the mundane world apply at Dragonfest. Be considerate of all other participants, including those whose spiritual tradition, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, race and other ways differ from your own. Be sensitive to the needs of others as well as your own needs. Be quiet at quiet times and in designated quiet areas. Be respectful of others' personal space and quiet needs. Be honest and trustworthy in dealings with others. Be considerate of both the Dragonfest and the campground staff. Be respectful of the site and the plants, animals and all of the Spirits of Nature that dwell on the land.

No Hunting of Animals: Plant foraging is not permitted and wood cutting is permitted only with the prior approval of the Lady of the Lake.

Responsible Land Management: Land is fragile in this part of the country. An arid climate in combination with a shortened growing season in the mountains of Colorado makes for a delicate balancing act in land usage. Tire marks can take up to ten years to heal. Automobile coolants and lubricants can do nearly permanent damage to the landscape. Placing a piece of cardboard under your vehicles engine compartment can help protect the land. Tread lightly on Mom.

Responsible Waste Management: Please don't litter. Keep your camp area clean throughout your stay and do a final clean-up before your departure. A recycling service will be established and provided for recycling plastic, aluminum, other metals, glass, and other materials. Bring your own trash bags and recycling containers to use, and deposit sorted trash, food scraps, and recyclables in the recycling truck during its daily runs through the Retreat site. Keep foodstuffs tightly covered to prevent raids by wild creatures. Be certain that coolers are in your vehicle by sunset. Coolers left sitting out will be confiscated by Safety. To reclaim your cooler you will need to sign up for an additional work shift. **DON'T FEED THE BEARS!**
